Explanation of odd stuff on the list:

- o **Sharpie, Super glue, Bootstrings, White cotton fabric** Trust me, these things will come in handy in ways you never fathomed.
- Electrical tape even better than moleskin for blisters! Cover the blister or irritated area with a band-aid, then a layer of electrical tape.
- **Emergen-C** a powdered multi-vitamin drink good for dehydration or as a hangover preventative.
- Vicks Vaporub can be used for congestion as intended, or as a muscle rub, or to stop itching from bug bites. Carmex can also help with itchy bug bites.
- Florajen acidophilus this is a capsule that contains lots of the bacteria found in yogurt. If you take it when traveling, you are less likely to get sick from Pennsic Plague or other gastrointestinal complaints.
- o **Disposable cutting boards** these are a wonderful invention! The cutting boards are essentially heavy wax paper with a plastic lining use them once and then throw the yuck away! (This is particularly good for chicken and other meats.)
- Disposable scrubbies also a great idea thick fiber pads with a scrubby size and a soft side and soap on the inside – use them to wash the dishes and wipe down tables, then throw away.
- o **Bitty cups/Taster cups** one of the most dangerous phrases in the SCA is "here, try this!" Having a bitty cup in hand to receive a small taste before offering your ginormous mug can be a lifesaver.

Notes:

- o If you are camping, try to arrange your travel so you arrive in daylight. Do a test set-up of your tent at home before you go there is nothing worse than setting up a new tent in the dark. If you try to do so, it will rain.
- o Do maintenance on the car (oil change, check tires, etc) BEFORE you leave
- You need a special form for car insurance in Canada. Most insurance plans can provide it at no or little cost, but make sure to order it in advance.
- o For long events, arrange for pet care, someone to at least check on the house/apartment, and have the mail and newspapers stopped or forwarded.
- You may want to construct a set-up kit that includes all the things you'll need (or may want) as soon as you hit site. Pack it on top or in between the front seats so it stays accessible throughout the trip. A possible list of things (either from above or a second set) to go in this box include:
 - Toolbox or other container
 - o First aid kit
 - o Multi-tool/Swiss army knife
 - o Raingear for each person
 - Mug or cup for each person
 - Matches
 - o Flashlight
 - o Tools (hammer/mallet, etc)
 - o Hardware for tent/pavilion
 - Work gloves
 - o Sunscreen
 - Bug spray
 - o Fire extinguisher
 - o Spare wire & rope
 - o "Travel and Arrival" items
